Public Speaking

We always have to come across public speaking either it is a team meeting or speech in front of big crowd. This not just boosts up our personality but can also help us to grab a better position. So it is necessary to have the right public speaking skills. The thing we should remember while preparing for a speech are the three Ps, i.e. Prepare, Practice and Perform. Talking about the first 'P' that is Prepare, which we normally do very well but the mistake we usually do is, we keep on mugging up the script to speak, that is the thing we should not be dependent upon. Instead, gather the information about your topic, arrange them in points and try to memorize it according to the points. Pick the points you must speak. Fix the time you will speak, and accordingly plan the points. That's it more effective than a script, but it is useless without a good practice. So here comes the second 'P' i.e. Practice. Here are a few ways of practicing. Practice in front of the mirror so that we could know our mistakes and try to improve them. Find some audience (e.g. our friends) to listen, it would be better if we find the people who can give us a genuine feedback. Practice without script instead practice with flash cards or the PPT presentation whatever you will use while performing. Also practice



with gesture you will use at your performance.

When you are done with your practice try to visit the place where you'll perform before sometime of your performance, stand on the stage, sit in audience's seat and try to get familiar with surrounding (if possible).

Now comes the most important part of all this, it is the Last 'P' which is performance. There are few things to remember while performing. Your gesture is your power which should be positive. Like, do not stand on one leg, do not put your hands in pockets, do not fold your hands, try to keep them close instead. Try to avoid pointing fingers at the audience. Try avoiding podium instead try the open space of the stage. 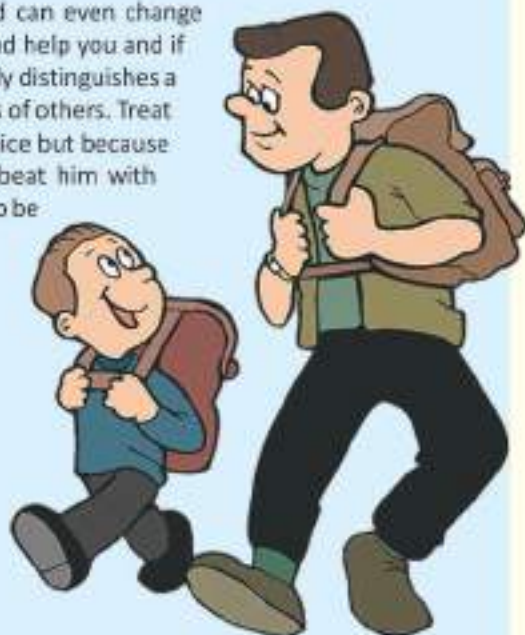
We become what we think. The outcomes of anything we do, totally depends on our attitude. If we are positive, we will get positive outcomes. If we are negative, we will get negative outcomes.

Learn to use **NON-PHYSICAL OPTIONS FOR DISCIPLINE**. If angry about something he/she has done, address the issue after calming down.

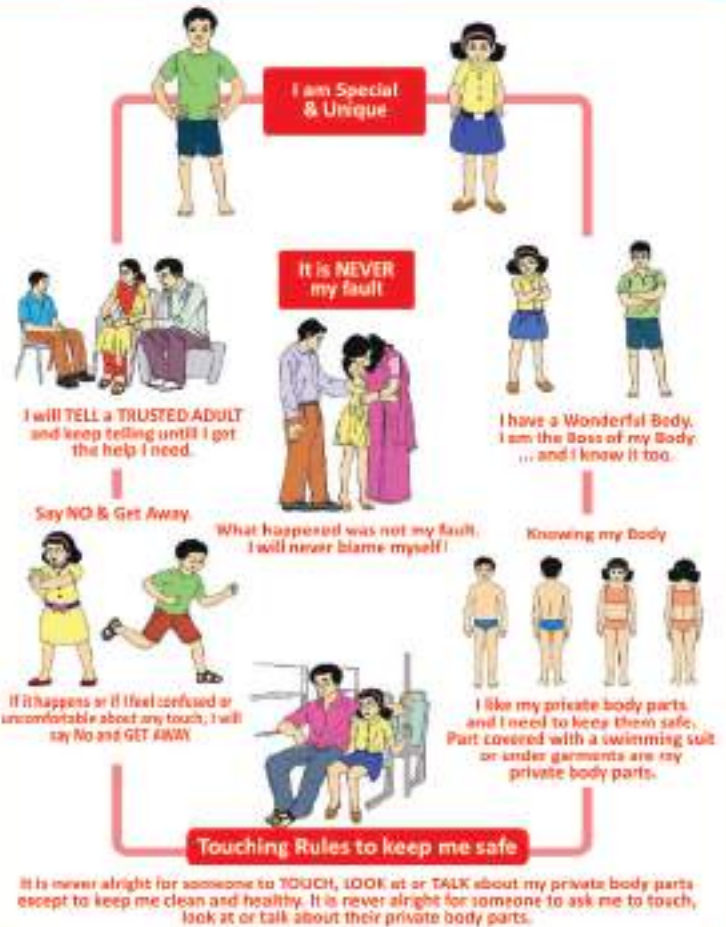


Let them know they have the **RIGHT TO SAY "NO"** to anyone, that includes adults. Especially when they feel it is wrong or **UNSAFE**.

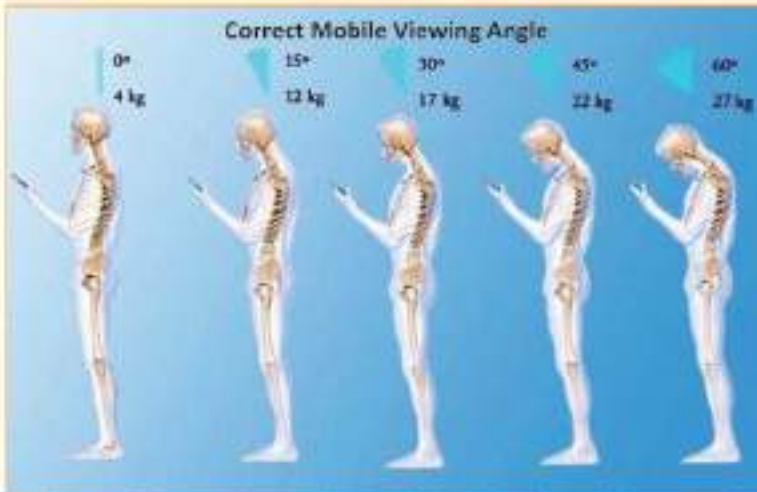
